Things to Bring to Class

CLOTHING

Everyday your child will have the opportunity to paint, play in the sand/water tables, glue, cut and draw. They will also go to the gym and other activities which may require them to roll up their sleeves and get messy. Please send your child in clothing that is clean and comfortable, but also clothing that can get dirty. The nursery school experience is about "experiencing" activities without worries.

FOOTWEAR

Since gym is a regular part of our day please be sure your child is wearing appropriate shoes. Dress shoes, laces and sandals are hazardous. Velcro runners are the best and preferred. Please change your child's footwear before entering the classroom (preferably in the lobby area) leaving outdoor shoes or boots on the shelf under the nursery school sign. Due to limited space we ask parents to keep their indoor runners in their child's backpack and bring it with them for every class. The fire regulation states that all children must have footwear on at all times. Boots are not allowed in the school classroom or gym; therefore, it is very important to remember to always bring their indoor shoes. From time to time, the children do remove their footwear. It is important that all footwear is clearly labelled with your child's name, for easy identification.

SNACKS

Please send a nutritious snack to school with your child in a lunch bag clearly labelled with your child's name. Snack time is a time to talk about healthy food choices and why they are important. NO NUT PRODUCTS ARE ALLOWED DUE TO SEVERE ALLERGIES.

A list of snack suggestions was provided to you in your child's welcome package. We ask that you stick to those items, and not send junk food such as pop, chocolate bars, or chips, as we would like to promote healthy snacks. If you do send anything that contains or may contain nuts, it will not be served to your child, it will be exchanged for an approved snack item. This policy is very strict and must be adhered to.

TOYS

Please leave all of your child's toys at home. Bringing in a security blanket or teddy bear that is to be kept in cubby until the end of class is fine, otherwise, all other toys should be left at home as we do not want children to lose their toys at school. There will be a "show 'n tell" where the children can bring in a toy, see the "Star of the Week" information in the Newsletter.

ONLY CHEQUES (No cash money)

On occasion, it will be necessary for your child to bring cheques to school. Always send cheques in a sealed envelope with the following information written on it: Your child's first and last name, your family name, the amount enclosed, the purpose for the cheque (i.e. book order, fundraiser, special event, tuition, treasurer, etc., the teacher's name, and Room #16 R.E.S.N.S. With many children attending and often several reasons for collecting cheques this helps the teachers as well as the Board a great deal and reduces the likelihood of errors. Also, if an envelope is left in a bag or cubby or dropped in the hallway, this information will help it to be returned to our classroom.

Thank you. We sincerely appreciate your cooperation.

We believe that a good parent/teacher relationship is a necessary component to achieve maximum program success. Throughout the year we will communicate with you through newsletters, conversation and student portfolios which will be handed out to parents in June.

Calming Those First Day of School Nerves

As we all know the first day, week, even month around the classroom to maybe bringing it in the of school can be a little nerve racking for us classroom and leaving it in there cubby in case as parents but especially for our littles!

Here are some tips on how to possibly calm some of those first day jitters:

Allow your child to bring in a small family picture to keep in their pants pocket close on hand, a special stuffie, a blankie or an item that comforts them. Something they can

bring from home as a transition piece. As the days and weeks go by we will slowly transition them from carrying the item to as they need it, to eventually one day not needing the item at all!

We know that not every child will need a transition item but for some this is very helpful and we want to be sure that school is a positive and fun experience for your child.

And if all else fails please remember that we have an open door policy so if need be and you feel it's appropriate for your child you are welcome to stay with them.

Scholastic Book Orders

Your child will bring home a scholastic order form to order books about once a month.

If you wish to order, you can place your order online, as instructed on the order form, or simply fill out the form, and a cheque made out to Scholastic Canada (cash is not accepted), and put both into a sealed envelope and return to your teacher.



These orders are provided as a convenient way for parents to buy quality books for their child at a low price. As an added bonus, our nursery school earns bonus points which are then used to purchase books and toys for our classroom. This is a winwin situation because you get quality literature at

DROP OFF & PICK UP TIMES

Before class begins the teachers are busy preparing for class and daily upcoming events, therefore, we kindly ask parents to arrive only a few minutes prior to the start of class times (9:30 am & 9:45 am for the morning classes, and 1:15 pm for the pm classes). The outside door is unlocked at 9:25 am (we ask that our children in our 9:45 am classes do not arrive prior to 9:40 so as to not have too much congestion in the hallway). In the afternoon, the doors will open at 1:10 pm. When dropping children off, parents and children must wait in the foyer (near the coat racks) for a teacher to welcome them to class as per Emerson School policy. Please help your child get ready for class by having them hang up their jacket and backpack, put on their indoor shoes, place their snack bag on the cart and wait quietly along the brick wall. The teachers will come to greet them and walk them to the classroom. This will make the transition into the classroom flow very smoothly.

A friendly reminder to please arrive five minutes PRIOR to dismissal time (11:40am, 11:55 am & 3:25 pm) to minimize the anxiety your child may feel if they are kept waiting.

I.D. IDENTIFICATION

If you are unable to pick up your child, the teachers must be notified verbally of this in advance. You must provide a short note or email with the name of the individual who will then be arriving in your place and their relationship to your child. The individual must be a person listed on the child's registration form. If unknown to the teachers, the individual MUST be able to provide identification. We must adhere to this for the safety of your child and as a nursery school regulation.

PARKING

Parents are kindly asked to abide by the Emerson School policy of NO PARKING ZONES. The south side of Glenway, by the school is a loading zone. If you are parking in front of the school to drop off/pick up your child, parking is allowed on the south side of Glenway for a maximum period of 15 minutes.

**Parents should not be parking on both sides of Glenway, as it blocks traffic. Also parents who are volunteering in the classroom, should not park in the school parking lot, or by the Glenway drop off area. There is parking allowed further down the street on the north side of Glenway, or there is parking on Emerson Avenue. Thank you for your co-operation in this matter.

FIRE DRILL EVACUATION

RESNS practices monthly fire drills with Emerson School and on our own. Although this can be a little scary for some children, it is very important to practice in case of an emergency.

Please be aware that in the event of a fire drill during class drop off or pick up times when you are in the building, you must follow fire drill protocol and evacuate the building and join us at our fire drill meeting place beside the play structure on the Glenway side.

CHILDREN'S FILES AND ATTENDANCE

Please remember to check your child's file regularly at drop off and/or pick up. Since the file folders are close together, please make sure you are taking items from the correct file folder.

BACKPACKS

Please send a backpack to school every class with your child. Please clearly label the outside of the backpack with your child's name. A complete set of clothes (pants, shirt, socks, underwear) should always be kept inside your child's backpack in case your child needs to be changed at nursery school. Please ensure all of your child's outerwear (boots, shoes, jackets, hats) and any other personal items are clearly labelled with their name to avoid any confusion and mix-up of items.

OUTDOOR FUN

We love the fresh Winter air! Weather permitting, we will be spending time playing outside. Please ensure your child brings appropriate outerwear every class to enjoy the outdoors in case we decide to go outside.

**The teachers will post a note on the snack cart if we plan to go outside that day so you will know when you arrive at nursery school.

CO-OP PARENTS

We love having parent volunteers in the classroom! Parents may be required to help with crafts, photocopy or laminate items, wash and clean art supplies, prepare snack tables and assist with other duties.

Due to licensing regulations and insurance coverage, siblings are not able to participate in the program during a parent's scheduled volunteer day or when there are school inservices. We ask that you make other arrangements for siblings on your scheduled co-op day. Please check the co-op schedule in advance so you do not miss your scheduled day.

If you are unable to attend your co-op day, it is your responsibility to find another parent to replace you.

ILLNESS

Please keep your child home if they are not feeling well, have a bad cough, fever or very runny nose. Viruses & germs spread quickly, so it's best for them to stay home until they are feeling better so others don't get sick too. Please call or email if your child will be away.

If you have not provided your family picture or individual pictures of your child, please bring them soon! We would like to complete our RESNS "Puzzle".

TOYS

Please do NOT send toys to school with your child. Many times these toys can get lost in the classroom or accidentally broken and this can be upsetting to your child. Your child may become possessive of this toy with friends as well.

There are special days throughout the year when your child can bring their favourite stuffed animal to nursery school. Also, they can bring a special "show and tell" toy when it's their turn as "Star of the Week".

FIELD TRIPS

Field trips are an exciting part of RESNS. They are fun, interactive and educational. It is a great time for children and their parents to meet as a group for a special excursion. A permission form is sent out prior to each field trip explaining the location, cost and other important information. It must be signed and returned with a cheque payment by the due date indicated on the letter.

As per RESNS policy, parents or guardians must transport their child to and from the field trip location as well as stay for the duration of the field trip. We realize some families may not be able to attend all field trips. If your child is unable to attend, there will be no school for them that particular day.

SPECIAL REQUEST

To all parents and board members, if you need to discuss information pertaining to school matters please try and speak with us after class unless your concern is of an urgent nature. If you have any questions pertaining to student fees, policies and procedures, class time and/ or cleaning deposits, contact the Chairperson, Alisha VanHelvert at akeating1988@hotmail.com.

PARENT PARTICIPATION

Our nursery school is a non-profit co-op school which is operated by volunteer parents. An executive committee of eight members as elected from the general membership, and the director as the staff member representative, constitute a board, and therefore, we require your support and volunteer work throughout the school year in order to function successfully. Thanks to our staff and 2016-17 board members, our registration

of children to our program is outstanding. We are pleased to say that both morning and afternoon classes are comprised of lively groups of 18 to 20 children.

CO-OP PARENT SCHEDULE

A Parent co-op schedule will be sent out to each co-op family. If your name appears on a day you are unable to attend it will be your responsibility to find another co-op parent to switch days with. We ask parents to please be flexible and to always inform us of any changes to their schedule they have made by email.

NON CO-OP MEMBERS

Are required to take two turns throughout the school year to do some housekeeping. A cleaning schedule and details will be provided. All members are required to participate in fundraising activities throughout the year, if need be. Your efforts will be recognized by the children, teachers and parents.

Best Ever Playdough Recipe

1 cup Flour

2 tbsp Cream of tartar

¼ cup Salt

1 cup Water

1 tbsp Oil

2 tsp Food colouring

Mix first three ingredients together, add remaining and cook over medium heat, stirring constantly (3 to 5 minutes).

When the dough forms and pulls away from the sides of the pan, remove from heat. Knead the dough until smooth. Careful it will be quite warm!
